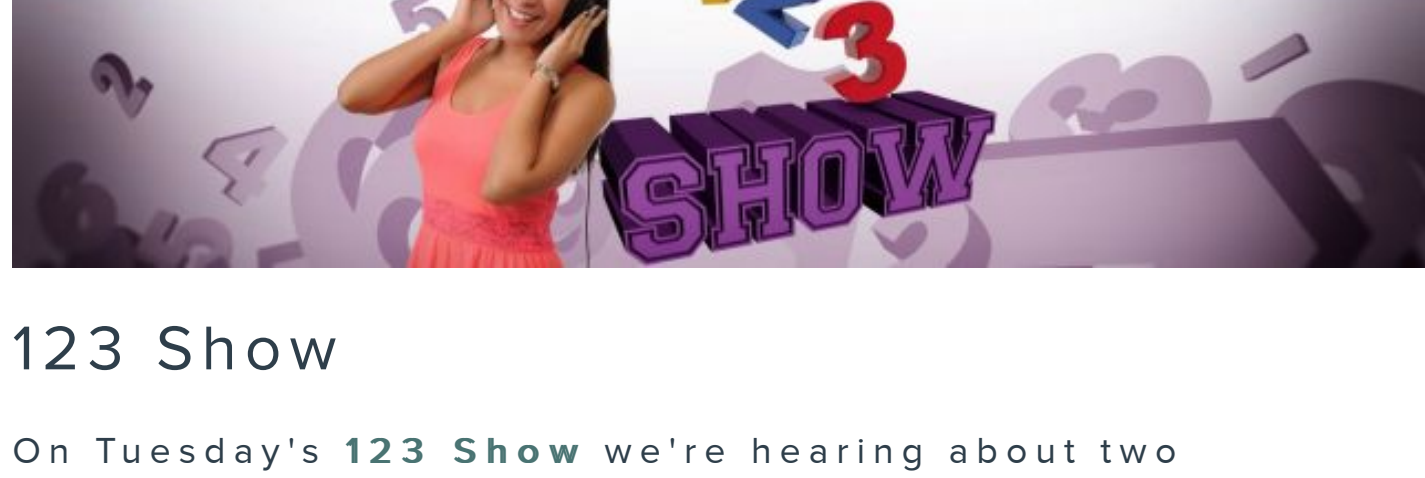


The Early Days with Ray

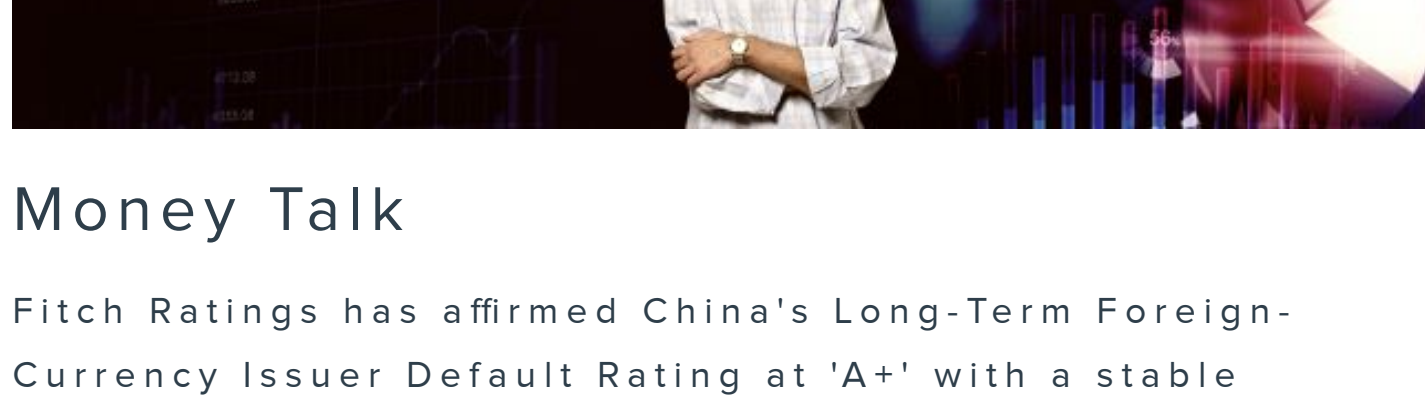

Money Talk

Fitch Ratings has affirmed China's Long-Term Foreign-Currency Issuer Default Rating at 'A+' with a stable outlook. Fitch said China's ratings are supported by the country's robust external finances, a record of tempus and resilient macro performance, and size as the world's second-largest economy.

US stocks started the final week of June by jumping to record highs, led by the technology sector. The S&P 500 index climbed a quarter of a percent to 4,290, its third straight record close. The Nasdaq Composite Index rose 1% to an all-time closing high of 14,500. With just two trading sessions left in the first six months of 2021, the S&P 500 is on track for first half gains of over 14%. The Nasdaq Composite Index is currently up 12.5% for the first six months of the year.

We are now calling for a new round of funding proposals:

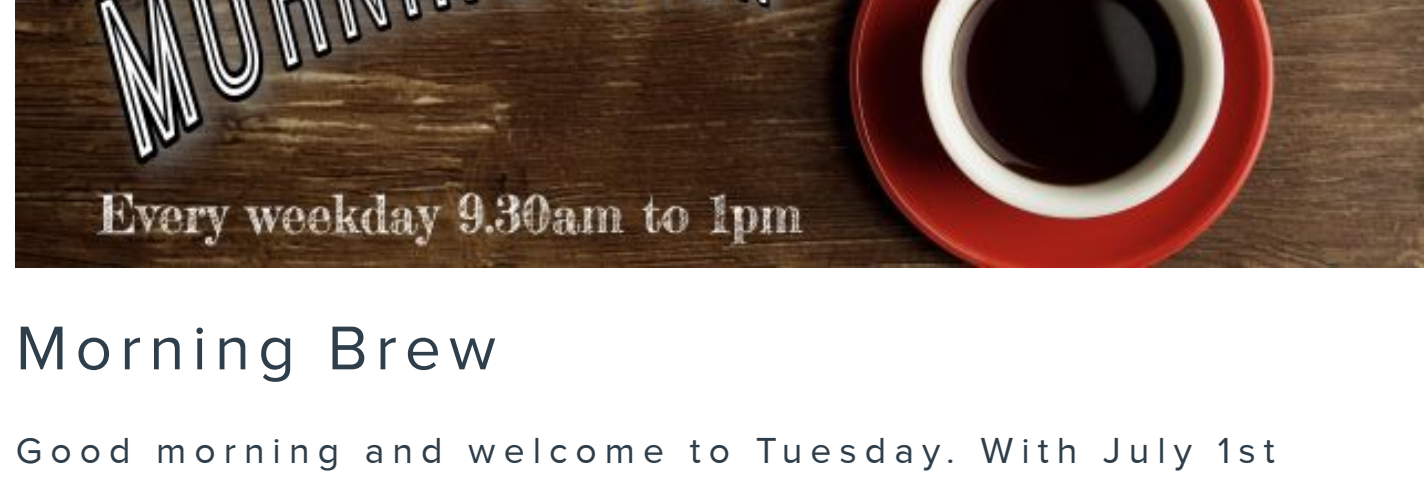
- Applicants must be non-profit charitable organisations registered in Hong Kong and exempt from tax under section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance.

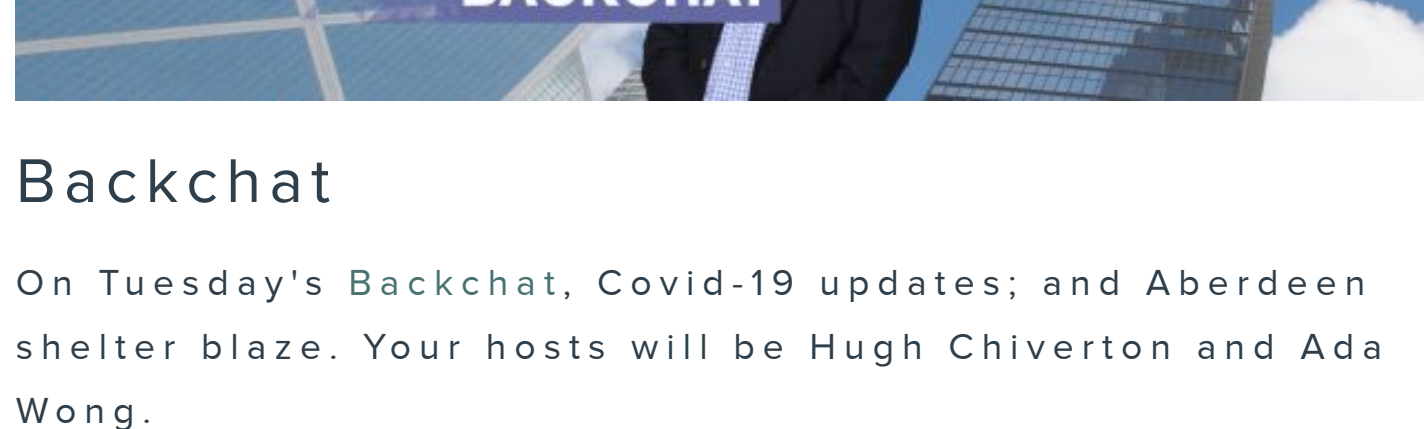

Backchat

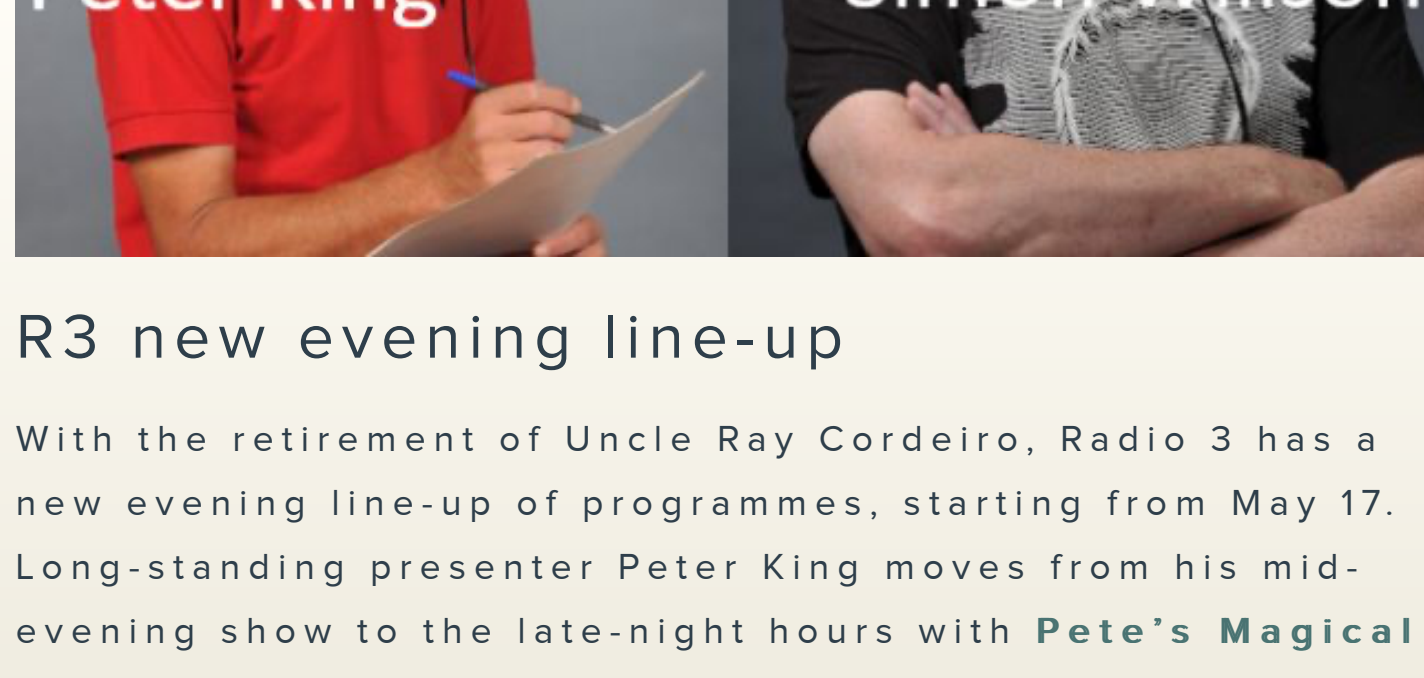
On Tuesday's Backchat, Covid-19 updates; and Aberdeen shelter blaze. Your hosts will be Hugh Chiverton and Ada Wong.

Hong Kong has recently recorded two positive cases for a more contagious Delta variant. Health experts have warned that a shopping centre in Tai Po could become a "superspreading" site and trigger another wave.

Meanwhile, the vaccination rate is on the rise, with officials predicting the local inoculation rate could hit 50% as early as August.
